
Trim-A-Tip™ Tool

- More angles, more options! Piece a huge variety of angled designs.



How to use with templates:

1. Cut template out on the stitching line. Try to be as precise as possible. Place rolled masking tape on the back side of the template; this will keep it from moving when cutting. Be sure to place a piece of rolled masking tape on sharp points.



2. Cut fabric into rectangles, triangles or squares leaving more than $\frac{1}{4}$ " on all sides. Stack up 4-6 layers of fabric. Place template on fabric.





3. Place Add-A-Quarter, lip side down next to the template. Cut all sides with rotary cutter.



4. To trim the tip; align the angle lines on the Trim-A-Tip™ with the angle on the template. For angles that are not exactly 30°, 45°, 60°, or 67 ½° find the angle that comes closest to the angle that is needed. Center it on the cut piece and trim off the corner.

5. The trimmed tips line up, making it easy to piece using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.



How to use with rotary cutting:

1. Cut out the pieces you need with quick rotary cutting method and the angled lines on your rotary cutting ruler. Align the angle lines on the Trim-A-Tip™ with the matching angle on the fabric piece.



2. Trim off the excess corner fabric.



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
